

## **Extra Credit – Web Page Tutorial – Teach a topic**

You have chosen to take a lesson topic from Science class or a science topic of your interest and turn it into a web page tutorial. This will be your extra credit for this marking period. It will add 2% to your marking period average. You will need the following to achieve this task:

1. Good notes / Sources
2. Be able to use / learn a web page program like FrontPage, Netscape, or other.
3. Follow the rubric of “what to do” for this task (below)
4. Be able to present concepts in a logical order that is meaningful
5. 4 external links that are relevant to your selected topic
6. Create a one-page tutorial or a multi-page web site.
7. Use and cite at least 2 resources and include on last page of your web site.
8. Save your file to your Public Folder on the school network. Create a new folder named “Science”. You may also save it to disk if it can fit. There is no need to publish the web page on the Internet. Turn in a note indicating the assignment is complete and the location of the file.
